about the program

Skills For Hire was created to help fill the need for qualified talent in the tech sector. The program is free and begins with a pilot roll-out for residents of Nova Scotia and Newfoundland & Labrador who are at least 18-years-old, hold a high school diploma, and who are interested in web design and development.

The **core skills** course path includes:

- online courses in web coding & programming
- online courses in career building skills
- touchpoints with subject-matter experts
- a discuss channel for all participants

foundations of web design

The first step to creating effective websites is to learn the coding languages that tell a browser what to display on a user's screen. Our learning path covers **HTML5**, **CSS**, **JavaScript** and front-end web design and development basics.

This learning path will prepare participants for an entry-level career in web design. In addition, the program teaches skills in job search success and workplace productivity. After mastering the foundational concepts included in the **core skills** course path, students who want to expand their knowledge can select from variety of additional course options in the **level-up** catalogue.

The program flows at a pace determined by each individual participant, but to get the most from the experience, the **core skills** course path is designed to be completed within 6-10 weeks.

While there are many ways to create websites with drag-and-drop templates, employers expect professional web designers to be fluent in coding languages to create custom-built websites and web-based applications.

HTML5 `</>`

Hypertext Markup Language (HTML) is the default file format for web documents. You'll need to know HTML5 to add information and different types of content to a website.

CSS `{:}`

Cascading Style Sheets (CSS) tell web browsers how to display fonts, colours, shapes and even animations. This language adds the element of style to the information on your website.

JavaScript `("")`

You'll be able to write front-end client side code, back-end code for servers, or even develop games, with JavaScript, the most widely-deployed programming language in the world.
